In February 2022, the ABS announced the move to competency-based assessment of surgical trainees with the introduction of the ABS Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs) Project, launching in July 2023 for general surgery programs.

Not the Environmental Protection Agency. We're talking about Entrustable Professional Activities—part of a competency-based assessment of surgical trainees.



This is when the ABS will launch EPAs for general surgery residency programs nationwide.
